Central Community School will be hosting an 'Earth Week' from April 28 – May 2, 2008 to have students and families participate in making our community environment 'greener.'

## Book Exchange RE-USE / RECYCLE EVENT

### Why?

One of the school goals is to increase student awareness of environmental issues: recycling and re-using is an important value to learn. We all have books at home that were a "good read" but that we no longer want or need. This is an opportunity to recycle those books so that other families may enjoy them. It is also a chance to boost your own home library with some new reading material.



### What is it?

A chance to trade in old books you have at home for other used books to take home and enjoy.

The books you trade in should be in decent condition so that everybody leaves with a quality book. Please check to see that pages aren't missing, ripped, or coloured on.

### How does it work?

Between Tuesday, April 8<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, families can bring their old books to Mr. Hunt in the Library. He will provide you with a voucher / ticket for each book you trade in. On Wednesday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, students will be able to return their vouchers in exchange for new books.

### When and where is it?

Drop off books between April 8 and April 30 in the School's Library (get your vouchers / tickets in exchange for your books)



**Wednesday, April 30<sup>th</sup>:** Exchange tickets / vouchers for books

The exchange station will be set up in the **Multi-Purpose Room**.

Students and families will be able to exchange tickets for books at these times:

8:20 – 8:40 a.m. Before school                      8:45 – 10:00 a.m.                      Classes will visit  
2:00 – 3:00 p.m. After school
